SAFETY

START OF THE SCHOOL DAY

1

Students will wear masks while on any type of bussing

2

Temperature scanners will be utilized for all students and staff entering the building

3

Hand-held temperature checks will be utilized for alternative entrances to the building

4

All adults and students will be required to wear face masks while on district property. Vaccinated teachers can substitute a shield instead of a mask. Students will have mask breaks while eating and outdoors

1

Breakfast will occur inside the classrooms

2

Middle and High School students will be provided bottles of water upon entering the building

3

Elementary students can bring empty bottles to school to fill up at water stations

NOURISHMENT

Social distancing of three feet in common areas will be maintained

All classrooms will have HEPA filters

- HEPA filters will be purchased for large areas (Café, Library and Offices)

Hand sanitizer will be available in every classroom

01

All students will enter each class period and sit at an assigned desk

02

Students will use hand sanitizer upon entering the room

03

At the completion of each period, each student will grab a sanitary wipe and clean off their desk before exiting the classroom

CUSTODIAL CLEANING

Custodial staff will use the Clorox 360 to disinfect the buildings

Sanitation sticker will be placed over each classroom door to ensure it was cleaned by the start of the instructional day

Spraying of the room

Sanitization of touch points

Trash

Restricted access for visitors

- Only wrap around services will be permitted in the building. This includes TSS, BSC, Community Partners (Universities, Health and Careers) and County Social Workers
 - Please call if a question arises concerning an individual entering the building
- Parents needing to pick up a student are required to wear a mask and must remain in the main office

STUDENT SIGN OF EXPOSURE/ILL

If a student shows signs of being ill, the staff member will do the following:

Teacher or staff excuses student(s) from classroom, cohort or area within the school. Alert the COVID-19 POC. The nurse in each building will be the Point of Contact.

COVID-19 POC takes student(s) to isolation room/area and ensures student(s) is properly supervised and masked. The parent, guardian, or caregiver will be called and asked to pick up their child within 30 minutes. Multiple ill students must be placed in the same isolation room/area, where masks will be worn and students kept six feet apart.

Parent, guardian, or caregiver picks up student(s). Parent, guardian, or caregiver contacts healthcare provider for evaluation and possible COVID-19 test. Note: If a school does not have a routine screening testing program, the ability to do rapid testing on site could facilitate COVID-19 diagnosis and inform the need for quarantine of close contacts and isolation.

TEST RESULTS

Student negative COVID-19 test result.

- Student(s) return to school following existing school illness management policies.

Student positive COVID-19 test result.

- Student(s) found to have COVID-19 and begins home isolation.
- COVID-19 POC starts a list of close contacts of the ill student(s) and informs staff, parents, guardians, or caregivers of close contacts of possible exposure. This process will be handled by the nurse at each location.
- COVID-19 POC works with local health officials to assess spread and support follow up with staff, parents, guardians, or caregivers of student(s) that had contact with the ill student(s).
- Parents, guardians, or caregivers of close contacts are advised to keep their children home (quarantine according to local health department requirements) and to consult with the student(s)' healthcare provider for evaluation and possible COVID-19 test. Students will have access to temporary remote instruction while in quarantine.
- Members of the ill student(s)' household and staff who had close contact with the student are advised to quarantine according to local health department requirements.
- The ill student(s) can return to school and end isolation once the following are met:
- 10 days out from the start of the symptoms, AND Fever free for 24 hours without fever reducing medication, AND symptoms have improved.



STAFF

- The district is creating a survey for all staff to determine vaccination status
- In partnership with Hamilton Health Center and/or the PA Department of Health, we may have rapid testing for staff twice per week
- The district will coordinate with HEA and admin to create a plan for teachers who test positive

INSTRUCTION FOR STUDENTS WHO ARE QUARANTINED

- The district 'has' two options:
 - Students can access asynchronous assignments through Google Classroom
 - Students can have access to taped lessons by classroom teachers
 - The cooperating teachers can use the 'owl' in their classroom. The owl camera is a 360 degree rotating camera with a speaker that immerses remote students in the live classroom. The concurrent model will allow for teachers to instruct students in class and at home
